Now that we are halfway through the 2021-2022 season it's time to start thinking tournaments. The Florida State USBC will begin its tournament season in March with the Pepsi and Florida Youth Handicap. Then the first two weekends in April we will be holding the Bob & Connie Peters Memorial Mixed Tournament hosted by Southwest Florida USBC at Coral Lanes in Cape Coral, FL. May 7 - June 26 will be the Open State Championship also hosted by Southwest Florida USBC. The Women's State Championship will be hosted by Space Coast USBC May 21 – June 12. The Youth Scholarship is being hosted by Sarasota-Manatee USBC June 4 – 19. We're looking for another successful tournament season.

To follow up, the Men's Only Tournament had a great turnout. There were outstanding scores bowled including the national high two men series. Danny Battles rolled an 827 and his partner Steve Baran rolled an 854 for a 1681 series. At that time, they also held the single game high score of 589 for two men.

In the last newsletter I mentioned National Eagle winners and that the Eagles were not available for presentation at the awards banquet. The Eagles finally landed and I and Director Frank Collins had the privilege of presenting them in front of their peers during their league.

When this newsletter comes out, we will have held our winter board meeting. I'm looking at having a productive meeting and hopefully some new ideas to report in the next edition.

Our Youth program continues to shine. We wouldn't be able to do the things we do without sponsorship. With their help, we have been able to award \$1,750 in scholarship money. These scholarships are awarded for bowling 50 pins over average, 100 pins over average and having a clean game. The youth program also held its 1st tournament, New Year's 8 Game

Sweeper. During this tournament, Braden Colaire (first year bowler) came in 2nd and 6th place. He earned \$515 in scholarship money. Way to go Braden!!!

State Tournament participation is making a comeback, most all of tournaments have increased in entries. Check out our state website for tournament information at Floridastateusbc.com and get your entry in before the deadlines close for our 2022 tournaments. Once again money from USBC will be added to our main 3 tournaments to enhance the prize list, \$5,000 to the Open, \$3,000 to the Women's Championship and \$2,000 to the youth.

Tournament entries for 2023 will be handed out at the October annual meeting in October and will be available on our website

Tournament bid packets for local associations to bid on our state tournaments for 2024 will be sent out from the state office in the next few weeks. **New deadline** to submit bids is June 30th. Tournaments up for bid are the Pepsi, the State youth Scholarship, The Open Championship, The Women's Championship, The Bob and Connie Peters Memorial Mixed, Senior Women's, Men's Only and the Landen youth tournament. Remember local associations will receive 75% of the profits on all the adult tournaments. It is a great opportunity to raise money for your local association.

SMART Program

The USBC Board of Directors has approved four policy changes for its Smart program and three of them take effect immediately.

Two of the changes pertain to the SMART deposited annual earnings allocation that has traditionally only been distributed through provider accounts. Recipient accounts now will receive 50% of the total allocation. Any remaining allocation will then be split 50/50 between provider accounts and recipients. A total of 75% of the recipient portion will be awarded to active recipients that requested funds the previous year, with 25% awarded as part of the new grant program.

Another exciting change is going into effective August 1, 2023, and more information on that will follow.

The final change has been highly requested and has been approved. A Recipient who is 21 years of age or older now can transfer their funds to a family member. The family member must have at least four years of USBC membership (not required to be consecutive) and be within eight years of their high school graduation.

There is a lot of money there for our youth bowlers to take advantage of and hope everyone will pass this information along.

Speaking of Smart Scholarships available, the Florida State USBC Board has two annual scholarships we award, the Patsy Wedding Scholarship Fund and the J.J. Garrett Memorial Scholarship Fund. We award eight to fifteen \$1000.00 scholarships for the Patsy Wedding Scholarship and one \$1000.00 winner to the J.J. Garrett Scholarship fund. The deadline for both is May 1. 2022. What Was Your Reaction to The Incident?

A couple of weeks ago, during the PBA Players Championship semi-finals, Sean Rash made a spectacle of himself when he made a statement (from the approach) that has caused a lot of discussion amongst the bowling crowd. He complained and made inferences that there was a problem with the integrity of the Professional Bowling Association (PBA), he doesn't think that certain urethane balls should be used in tournaments, doesn't appear to like two-handed bowlers, and used profanity within the context of the statement. This juvenile, unsportsmanlike behavior was an affront to the association, ball manufacturers and fellow bowlers by spouting out during a major event. He has now been fined, put on probation for a year and suspended from entering one of the tournaments this year. Some people applauded him saying a little controversy will make the sport more exciting to watch, etc. I for one am glad that he was given those penalties. We encourage our youth bowlers to watch the events on tv and for that reason alone, the profanity (though somewhat mild) did not belong there. He has been on tour for a number of years now and I think that if he has a complaint, it should be brought up through the regular channels not on National broadcasts. He is jeopardizing his livelihood as well since the people governing and sponsoring the sport don't like the negative press. I would love to hear what all of you think about this occurrence.

From what I understand, there is already an ongoing investigation about the legality of said urethane bowling equipment anyway.
